Workshop Descriptions

Barbara Rockman (morning) Room 122 Excavating Home: Embracing The Domestic Image

Marcel Proust said, "In reality, as soon as each hour of one's life has died, it embodies itself in some material object. There it remains captive, captive forever, unless we should happen on the object, recognize what lies within, call it by its name, and so set it free." Magritte said that objects "shriek and hold potential to become something else." Writer, Carole Maso, says, "Things we have forgotten hold weight, shape, light and meaning; in the emblematic there is heat and emotion." In this generative workshop we will travel to rooms we have known. From cellar to front hall, kitchen to attic, shed to cabinet, we will gather objects that radiate emotion and mystery. We might retrieve vase, viola, ax, aquarium, door knob, doll or belt. In re-imagining them through associative writing, we will access family history, metaphor and memory. An extensive hand-out of essay excerpts and poems inspired by domestic image will be discussed.

Barbara Rockman teaches poetry at Santa Fe Community College and in private workshops. As Workshop Coordinator for Wingspan Poetry Project she brings poetry to victims of domestic violence. Her poems have received three Pushcart Prize Nominations, the New Mexico Discovery Award, The MacGuffin Poets Hunt Prize, Southwest Poetry Prize, and the Baskerville Publisher's Prize. She is author of "Sting and Nest," which received the National Press Women Book Prize and the New Mexico-Arizona Book Award. A new collection is forthcoming from University of New Mexico Press. Barbara received her MFA in Writing from Vermont College of Fine Arts.

Manuel González (afternoon) Room 120 Digging Up Roots: Cultural identity and metaphor

In this workshop, we will explore the use of cultural identity in our work. From the time we are born, many traditions and life lessons have brought us to where we are today. These soul feeding experiences enrich the tierra that sparks of creativity grow from. Time to work the land.

Current Poet Laureate of Albuquerque, NM, Manuel González, is a performance poet who began his career in the poetry slam. Manuel has represented Albuquerque on a national level as a member of the Albuquerque poetry slam team 2000, 2002, 2003, 2007. He has also appeared on the PBS show, Colores: My word is my power. Manuel was one of the founding members of the poetry troupe The Angry Brown Poets. Manuel also has a collection of his poetry published by Swimming with Elephants Press entitled, But my friends call me Burque...

Manuel teaches workshops on self-expression and poetry in schools, at-risk youth facilities, youth detention centers and most recently at the Transgender Resource Center of New Mexico. Manuel is from Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Kelley and Pamela Yenser (morning & afternoon) Room 123 What's Form Got to Do with It/Got to Do with It?

Poems always assume a form, an organizing principle, sometimes organic and sometimes arbitrary. Some forms are traditional and recognizable and others are not. This workshop will focus on how to use form to make a poem, whether a sonnet or "free verse." We are interested in using form as a tool to begin and to finish a poem. We understand form as an opportunity to work on a poem, not a template to be be filled in. The prompt(s) will involve this practical use of form.

Jon Kelly Yenser was born and raised in Kansas. He worked as a teacher, a journalist and academic fund-raiser for institutions in several states before retiring to read and write in Albuquerque.

He has published two chapbooks, Walter's Yard (Kattywompus Press, 2013) and The Disambiguation of Katydids (2015, Kattywompus). His first book-length collection of poems, The News as Usual, will be published by the University of New Mexico press in 2018.

Pamela Yenser (MA, MFA) Editor at Fawkes Press, is a 50-year university instructor with poems in ascent, Massachusetts Review, Midwest Quarterly, Poetry Northwest, Shenandoah, Connotation Press, Kansas Poets, and numerous anthologies. She is a Pushcart and AWP nominee; winner of Fugue, Antietam, and American Academy of College Poets awards; and Other Voices finalist.

Elizabeth Raby (morning & afternoon) Room 121 Writing the List Poem

In this list poem workshop we will look at some examples from Walt Whitman, Alan Ginsburg and Anne Valley-Fox. We will also make our own lists.

Elizabeth Raby is the author of five full-length poetry collections, the most recent of which is A Matter of Time, (2016), and of a four generation memoir in poetry and prose, Ransomed Voices, (2013). Her work has appeared in many journals and anthologies and has been translated into Chinese and Romanian. She worked as a poet-in- the-schools in NJ and PA and for the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation and she taught poetry at Muhlenberg College.
