

Updates from the President

The Annual Convention of the National Federation of State Poetry Societies (NFSPS) was held on June 29-July 2 at Fort Worth Texas. NM attendees/delegates were **Bernadette Perez**, **Hakim Bellamy**, **Shirley Blackwell**, and--last but not least--**Scott Wiggerman**, who kicked off on Friday morning with the convention's first program, a workshop called "Words at the Speed of Sounds: Poetic Effects through Sounds." We learned how various "levels" of English vowel sounds can add emotional resonance and meaning to one's poems and how consonant sounds can affect tone. Scott concluded with a brief writing exercise in which participants "riffed" off a Denise Levertov poem. Educational, inspiring, and wonderfully put together, Scott!

The Ft. Worth convention was also the site for the inaugural running of the BlackBerryPeach Prizes for Poetry: Spoken and Heard (BBP3). This is the first major NFSPS book competition to come on the scene since the mid-1990s, and its objective is to unite stage- and page- poets so that they can learn from each other. The written words of the top six finalists are in a beautiful chapbook titled *Blackberry Peach Poetry Awards 2017*, available on <u>Amazon.com</u>; a link to the audio submissions, available on SoundCloud, is printed in the book.

Hakim Bellamy, Albuquerque's first poet laureate, was the BBP3 judge. The variety of voices and genres was about as diverse as it could be, with first prize going to **Kari Gunter Seymour** of Ohio, whose touching but unsentimental portrayal of an Appalachian woman with sons at war in Afghanistan and Iraq brought more than one listener to tears. Our own **Zachary Kluckman** of Albuquerque won 1st Honorable Mention.

Alliteration

The repetition of the same initial letter, sound, or group of sounds in a series of words, as in the Hopkins' line "[king-]dom of daylight's dauphin, dapple-dawn-drawn Falcon..."

The Windhover, by Gerard Manley Hopkins

I caught this morning morning's minion, kingdom of daylight's dauphin, dapple-dawn-drawn
Falcon, in his riding
Of the rolling level underneath him steady air, and striding
High there, how he rung upon the rein of a wimpling wing
In his ecstasy! then off, off forth on swing,
As a skate's heel sweeps smooth on a bow-bend: the hurl and gliding
Rebuffed the big wind. My heart in hiding
Stirred for a bird, — the achieve of, the mastery of the thing!
Brute beauty and valour and act, oh, air, pride, plume, here
Buckle! AND the fire that breaks from thee then, a billion
Times told lovelier, more dangerous, O my chevalier!
No wonder of it: shéer plód makes plough down sillion
Shine, and blue-bleak embers, ah my dear,
Fall, gall themselves, and gash gold-vermilion.

Challenge: Write a poem about a moment when you felt uplifted and transformed by watching an animal in nature. For an extra challenge, experiment with some of the poetic devices that Hopkins uses so beautifully in The Windhover.
