Categories: #1 Rhymed, #2 Free Verse, #3 Southwest (theme, reference, or setting), #4 Humor, #5 Youth (poets 18 and under). 1st Prize: \$40, 2nd Prize: \$25, 3rd Prize: \$15, prizes in every category. Any form, 40-line limit (no exceptions). Poems must be original work of the entrant (please, no poems that have won in the past in any NMSPS Contests only); previously published accepted, including electronic; typed or computer generated (not hand-written or printed), and single-spaced; without illustrations; written in English; and titled, unless a haiku. No more than six (6) poems per entrant.

Send two (2) clear copies of each poem on 8 1/2" by 11" white paper in black ink. On **BOTH** copies, place category # and description at upper left corner. For poems over 1 page, put page number on upper left, just below category designation. On second copy **ONLY**, add poet's name, address, telephone number, and e-mail address (if any) at upper right.
